1. How do they start their presentations?

2. What words do you hear them use to communicate their message?

Jobs frequently uses powerful and emotional words like "amazing," "revolutionary," and "incredible" to create excitement. He also personalizes his speech by sharing his enthusiasm, as seen in phrases like "This is a day I've been looking forward to for two and a half years." 🔨

3. What visual aids to they use?

Gates prefers a more technical and structured approach, using terms such as "global impact," "trends," and "data shows." He highlights innovation and problem-solving, ensuring that his audience understands the significance of the information presented.

Jobs uses clean, minimalistic slides with simple but impactful visuals, often a single image or a few keywords. He also incorporates live product demonstrations to sho wcase features in real time.

4. What is on those visual aids?

A Large images, single words, or short slogens that reinforce his key points in a straightforward yet powerful manner. Gates relies heavily on charts, graphs, and detailed slides filled with statistics and data to support his message and provide in-depth analysis.

Jobs follows the "Rule of Three," breaking his presentation into three key sections and reinforcing them with repetition. He also connects his points through storytelling, making the content easier to remember. Gates presents his ideas in a clear, structured, and logical flow. He summarizes key points at the end of each section and uses slides to help the audience stay engaged with the

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6. What do they do to keep you interested?

Jobs is a master storyteller, using humor, suspense, and dramatic reveals like his famous "One more thing..." moment. He makes the presentation feel like an experience rather than just an information session. Gates engages his audience by sharing insightful information, demonstrating technological advancements, and occasionally adding personal experiences to make his message more relatable.

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
