1. How do they start their presentations?

Steve Jobs started his presentation by building excitement before introducing the iPhone. He began by saying "This is a day I've been looking forward to for two and a half years"

2. What words do you hear them use to communicate their message?

Steve Jobs used "amazing" "incredible" and phrases like "This change everything" and "simple to use" to effectively build excitement and highlight the product.

Bill Gates focuses on technical aspects like "integrated" and "ecosystem."

3. What visual aids to they use?

Steve Jobs used large-screen projections, slide, presentation mouse and LCD projector.

Bill Gates also used slide, presentation mouse and LCD projector. He also used chart to explain the difference.

4. What is on those visual aids?

There are products images, live demos and feature comparisons with existing smartphones on Steve Jobs slide.

Bill Gates' slides include diagrams, comparisons, and text description of Microsoft's new services.
